A meeting of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District's Recreation Committee was held at the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, Carrington, North Dakota, on March 30, 2022. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Klein at 1 p.m.

OTHERS PRESENT

Garrison Diversion staff and others were in attendance. A copy of the registration sheet is attached to these minutes as Annex I.

The meeting was recorded to assist with compilation of the minutes.

READING OF THE MINUTES

Motion by Director Metzger to dispense with a reading of the September 3 and October 8, 2021, Recreation Committee minutes and approve them as distributed. Second by Director Cayko. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

CURRENT FUNDING AND PROJECT REVIEW

Merri Mooridian, Secretary, reviewed the list of current projects. The amount expended toward recreation projects in 2022 is \$116,135. The balance remaining to be expended on outstanding projects is \$930,726. A copy of the table showing current projects is attached to these minutes as Annex II.

EXPIRING PROJECTS

Dickey County Park Board - - Ms. Mooridian commented in May of 2019, the Dickey County Park Board was awarded \$973 to install a boat ramp sign at Pheasant Lake, but due to unforeseen circumstances, it did not get installed. Plans are still in the works to have the sign ready to install when weather conditions permit so an extension is being requested.

Ms. Mooridian suggested extending the project deadline until this summer.

Motion by Director Johnson to approve Dickey County Park Board's project deadline for the Pheasant Lake sign installation until July 1, 2022. Second by Director Cayko. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

Ms. Mooridian referred to the completed projects table. As of December 2021, funding in the amount of \$6.8 million has been awarded for recreation projects since the program's inception. Expenditures for the program are \$6.2 million. A copy of the table is attached to these minutes as Annex III.

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT APPLICATION

Swimming Pool Guidelines - - Bruce Klein, Chairman, said since changes were made to the Recreation Grant Application regarding eligible projects, questions have come up regarding what is allowed under swimming pools and ball parks. A potential recreation project applicant contacted Garrison Diversion asking if the installation of a new swimming pool liner qualified for program funding. At this time, no application has been submitted for funding of the pool liner; however, there is an application to be considered today for funds to install a new overlay surface on an existing tennis/basketball court.

Chairman Klein suggested the committee discuss these issues in order to provide guidance to the staff on how to address questions received from the grant applicants and whether these types of projects are going to be considered eligible.

The committee members questioned whether the swimming pool liner and overlay would fall under the category of maintenance. The applicants feel their projects provide a new feature with a long-life expectancy, and the costs are extremely less than constructing a new pool or ball court.

The committee determined funding allowed for pools should be for new construction only. Pool liners would not be eligible to receive funding. It was also decided resurfacing of ball courts is considered maintenance and would not be eligible for program funding unless it is to repurpose the facility.

REVIEW OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Maddock Park & Recreation Board - - The Maddock Park & Recreation Board is seeking \$22,099 for replacement of playground equipment at Maddock City Park. The total estimated project cost is \$88,396. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IV.

Bottineau County Commission - - The Bottineau County Commission is requesting \$859 to install playground edging at Carbury Dam Campground. The total estimated project cost is \$3,436. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex V.

Cass County Government - - Cass County Government requests funding assistance of \$638 to install additional water hookups at Brewer Lake Campground. The total estimated project cost is \$2,552. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VI.

Casselton Park District - - Casselton Park District is requesting grant funds in the amount of \$9,575 to construct an ADA compliant restroom at Tinta Tawa Park. The total estimated project cost is \$38,300. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VII.

Carrington Park District - - Randy Hooley, Director, Carrington Park District, presented their request for \$75,000 in grant funds for baseball/softball renovations at the city park. This includes building a new baseball diamond and upgrading the three existing diamonds in the park, as well as construction of a concession stand/bathroom, grand stands, scoreboards, dugouts/backstops and batting cages. The total estimated project cost is \$314,273. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VIII.

Carrington Park Board - - Lori Dietz and Michele Seil, representing the Carrington Park Board and Carrington Area Healthy Communities, addressed the committee regarding the park board's request for funds in the amount of \$61,202 to renovate Carrington's West Park, including purchase and installation of new ADA compliant playground equipment and construction of a unisex restroom. The total estimated project cost is \$244,809. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IX.

Binford Park Board - - The Binford Park Board requests \$2,950 to update and expand the playground area at the Binford City Park. The total estimated project cost is \$11,800. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex X.

Michigan Park Board - - Sarah Anderson, Michigan Park Board, presented the park board's request for \$15,000 in grant funds to purchase and install new ADA compliant playground equipment and to make the area ADA accessible at Michigan Park. The total estimated project cost is \$63,020. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$15,755. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XI.

Nelson County Park Board - - Steve Forde, Nelson County Park Board, addressed the committee regarding the request from the park board for funding of \$13,869 to install a new ADA playground near the Pavilion at Stump Lake Park. The total estimated project cost is \$55,475. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XII.

Wahpeton Park Board - - The Wahpeton Park Board requests \$42,000 in grant funds to construct a multipurpose shelter at Chahinkapa Park. The total estimated project cost is \$168,000. It was pointed out federal funds utilized for the project are unknown. This may need to be noted in the motion to award if the project is approved for funding. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIII.

Mantador Park Board - - The Mantador Park Board is requesting \$2,000 in grant funds for enclosed softball dugouts on the north side of Mantador City Park. The total estimated project cost is \$8,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIV.

Wyndmere Park Board - - The Wyndmere Park Board requests \$10,728 to construct a new ADA compliant restroom facility at the Wyndmere Rock Garden. The total estimated project cost is \$42,911. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XV.

City of Milnor - - The City of Milnor is requesting \$14,000 to develop a new playground in the Northview residential area. The total estimated project cost is \$56,839. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$14,210. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVI.

City of Woodworth - - The City of Woodworth is seeking grant funds in the amount of \$1,500 for its community development project, adding picnic tables, benches and planters along Main Street. The total estimated project cost is \$6,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVII.

City of Galesburg - - The City of Galesburg has requested funds in the amount of \$22,595 to purchase and install new ADA compliant playground equipment at the Galesburg Playground. The total estimated project cost is \$90,380. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVIII.

Mayville Park Board - - The Mayville Park Board requests \$7,985 for their Campground Beautification Project, which would complete the landscaping around the bathhouse located in the Willowood Campground. The total estimated project cost is \$31,940. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIX.

Hillsboro Park District - - Jim Murphy and Alyssa Short, representing the Hillsboro Park District and Traill Economic Development Corporation, presented the park board's request for \$31,500 in grant funds to install a new light structure system at Hillsboro's Olsen Softball Complex. The total estimated project cost is \$126,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XX.

North Dakota State Fair - - Craig Rudland, Assistant General Manager, North Dakota State Fair Association, presented a request from the association for \$27,500 to expand the camping spaces at the State Fairgrounds in Minot. The total estimated project cost is \$55,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXI.

Ward County Parks - - Les Malnaa, Ward County Parks, presented their request for \$10,362 to be used for park improvements at various park locations, including Talbott Court Park, Rice

Lake Swim Beach and Nelson Carlson Swim Beach. Improvements include a canoe/kayak launch, benches, picnic tables, trash receptacles and sun shade sails. The total estimated project cost is \$42,529. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXII.

Williston Parks & Recreation District - - Williston Parks & Recreation District is requesting funding of \$55,872 to be used for Phase I of the Coyote Clay Target League Range Project, which includes the construction of seven trap houses, including concrete; athlete stations, sidewalks, electricity and lighting, voice callers, poles and trap throwers. The total estimated project cost is \$223,488. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIII.

City of Wildrose - - The City of Wildrose is seeking grant funds in the amount of \$1,000 to develop a community garden site on Main Street in Wildrose. The total estimated project cost is \$4,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIV.

City of Sheldon - - The City of Sheldon requests \$5,000 to install a new surface over the top of the existing tennis/basketball court, creating a new surface for a pickleball court and basketball court in Sheldon. The total estimated project cost is \$21,048. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$5,262. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXV.

Kevin Boeder, President, Sheldon City Council, joined the meeting by conference phone to address questions regarding the application submitted by the City of Sheldon.

Chairman Klein stated the Recreation Committee normally funds projects that are for new construction and does not fund projects considered to be maintenance. The committee is not familiar with the new overlay process being proposed by the city and would like more information.

Mr. Boeder said the outdoor facility was built through grants years ago and has a basketball and tennis court. Over the years, the basketball court has been used by the younger people; however, the tennis court does not get utilized. The older citizens, who play pickleball along with those of many different ages, have expressed interest in a pickleball court.

Mr. Boeder said placing an overlay surface on top of the existing court(s) will fill in any cracks, chips or imperfections in the concrete, thus eliminating the expense of new concrete. The city would like to put a new surface down for a pickleball court, including the pickleball lines. In addition, the basketball court would be included with new boundary lines. The overlay is guaranteed to survive the various seasons in North Dakota.

Mr. Boeder added the city really does not need a new facility. The fencing, nets and backboards are in good shape and well maintained. A renovation is needed in order for the facility to be more utilized.

Mr. Boeder explained the overlay process and answered questions on project costs from the committee members.

The committee believed the project cost of the new overlay, considering the size of the court(s), is a good financial move. The cost to complete the project with new cement would be around \$50,000.

Director Krueger said the question is will the committee consider projects that resurface over older cement or foundations. Resurfacing is leaning toward repurposing and making something older better. The two options are either rip it all up and spend the money on concrete or apply the overlay, and the court(s) could last another 25 years.

Director Johnson stated some communities may not have the resources to rebuild a brand-new court but can save money by revitalizing the old one.

The committee members commented this is perhaps more of a new feature rather than normal maintenance; therefore, it was the consensus of the committee to provide funding for the new surface overlay.

Chairman Klein said he feels this is a new project if something new (pickleball court) can be made with the existing surface.

CONSIDERATION OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Motion by Director Walter to approve a grand total of \$385,132 to be allocated to the following recreation grant program applicants:

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$859 to the Bottineau County Commission for installation of playground edging and sand at Carbury Dam Campground.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$638 to Cass County Government for installation of five additional water hookups at Brewer Lake with the stipulation that funding does not include costs for the well and/or pump.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$9,575 to the Casselton Park District to construct an ADA compliant restroom at Tinta Tawa Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 to the Carrington Park District for baseball/softball renovations at the city park, including building a new baseball diamond and upgrading the three existing diamonds, as well as construction of a concession stand/bathroom, grand stands, scoreboards, dugouts/backstops/agrolime, umpire room and batting cages.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$61,202 to the Carrington Park Board for renovations at Carrington's West Park, including site preparation, purchase and installation of new ADA compliant playground equipment and construction of a bathroom facility.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,950 to Binford Park Board for updating and expanding the playground area at the Binford City Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$15,755 to Michigan Park Board to purchase and install new ADA compliant playground equipment and to make the area ADA accessible at Michigan Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$13,869 to Nelson County Park Board for the purchase and installation of playground equipment at Stump Lake Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$5,262 to the City of Sheldon for the installation of an overlay surface for the pickleball and basketball court.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$42,000 to the Wahpeton Park Board for construction of a multipurpose shelter at Chahinkapa Park. This grant award is contingent upon any federal funds that may be received.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,000 to the Mantador Park Board to construct softball dugouts, including interior benches at Mantador City Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$10,728 to Wyndmere Park Board to construct a new ADA compliant restroom facility at the Wyndmere Rock Garden.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$14,210 to the City of Milnor to develop a new playground in the Northview residential area.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$1,500 to the City of Woodworth for its community development project, adding picnic tables, benches and planters along Main Street.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$22,595 to the City of Galesburg to purchase and install new ADA compliant playground equipment at the Galesburg Playground.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$7,985 to the Mayville Park Board for the landscaping project in the Willowood Campground.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$31,500 to the Hillsboro Park District to install a new light structure system at Olsen Softball Complex.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$10,632 to Ward County Parks for a canoe/kayak launch facility, benches and trash receptacles at Talbott Court Park (\$4,135); park improvements at Rice Lake Swim Beach, including benches, picnic tables, sun shade sails and trash receptacles (\$2,800); and at Nelson Carlson Swim Beach (\$3,697), including picnic tables and sun shade sails.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$55,872 to Williston Parks and Recreation District for Phase I of the Coyote Clay Target League Range Project, which includes construction of seven trap houses, including concrete; athlete stations, sidewalks, electricity and lighting, voice callers, poles and trap throwers.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$1,000 to the City of Wildrose for development of a community garden site on Main Street.

Second by Director Metzger. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Klein, Krueger, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Director Metzger to approve up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$22,099 to Maddock Park & Recreation for new playground equipment at the Maddock City Park. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Klein, Krueger, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Abstaining: Johnson. Motion carried.

Motion by Director Walter to approve up to 50 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$27,500 for the campground expansion project, including 30-amp hookups in both the west and east camping lots at the North Dakota State Fair campgrounds. Second by Director Cayko. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Klein Krueger, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Project Description

The Carrington Area Healthy Communities, in partnership with the Carrington Park Board, is renovating the Carrington's west end park. The project will replace the old equipment to increase access and use, which in turn will promote and encourage outdoor recreation. The current equipment is not ADA compliant, is in poor condition, and no longer meets the needs of the community. The project committee is unable to identify the date the current equipment was installed, but members recall playing on it when they were children 40 years ago. The new equipment will be ADA compliant (meeting and in some areas exceeding the guidelines) and will meet the inclusivity needs of handicapped children. Also, community focus group discussions revealed a desire to have equipment that provides outdoor exercise and challenges for older children as most of the playground equipment in town is designed for preschool/early elementary children. The unique features of the playground design, including a climbing structure and a zipline will greatly enhance the appeal of the park and the overall experience that children and families will have as they visit the park. This park has a picnic shelter and basketball nets that will stay in place.

While the Carrington community has three parks, the location of this park definitely meets the needs of a distinct population of citizens and visitors; thus the need to remodel is a high priority. The courthouse park was renovated two years ago by the Foster County Commission. This park is near the health center and serves the north side of town. The city park that is located next to Highway 281 was updated several years ago and, along with playground equipment, is the home to tennis courts, the city pool, and several baseball diamonds. This park serves the east side of the city. However, access is somewhat restricted as children must cross Highway 281, a major highway with heavy traffic. When the Carrington Public Schools moved their elementary facility to the east side of Highway 281, the playground on the site of the old school was removed. This equipment was often used by children and families who live in the center and south sides of town, as it was the closest playground. These families must now use the renovated Courthouse park or this outdated park on the west side of town. Many of the children on the west side of town live in lower-economic households, and they do not have transportation to the other parks that are a great distance away (more than a mile for some).

There are two additional benefits to the park renovation project. First, the design moves all the playground equipment into one area, which will decrease the need to trim and mow around individual pieces. Currently, the swings and the merry-go-round are separated from the rest of the playground equipment, requiring additional maintenance work. Secondly, including in plans for this park renovation is adding a single-stall, unisex bathroom. There are no businesses on that end of town that are accessible for bathroom use, which is a difficult problem for families with small children. Simply adding a bathroom will greatly enhance the visitor's experience and further encourage use of the playground.

The park will serve the citizens of Carrington, which has a 2020 census of 2080 residents and is near the county museum, daycares, the fairgrounds, and the low-income trailer park. As Carrington is at the crossroads of two major North Dakota highways, it serves as a hub for area commerce, drawing people from Foster (2020 census 3397 residents), Wells, Eddy, Griggs and Stutsman counties. The Foster County Fairgrounds is just a few blocks from the park, so visitors to the museum and to the fairgrounds for the county fair, the annual Junkfest, weddings, and other events will enjoy the renovated park.

Project Planning

The mission of the project partner, the Carrington Area Healthy Communities Coalition, is to create a healthier community by promoting and supporting initiatives that promote a healthy lifestyle, including physical activities. In developing their strategic plan, the Coalition looked at the community's playgrounds as an essential opportunity to encourage outdoor, physical activities for youth. Through a 2021 Community Health Needs Assessment, conducted by CHI St. Alexis Health Center and Foster County Public Health (both with members in the Coalition), renovating the west park was identified as

one of the steps integral to attracting and retaining young families in our area. The Coalition has hosted two focus group discussions to provide feedback opportunities for community members. Through these discussions, priorities were established: ADA compliance and accessibility, challenging equipment for older children, and bathroom facilities.

The playground equipment was chosen in part because of the excellent warranty and sustainability features. There is a 100-year warranty on the structural equipment and hardware, a 15-year warranty on plastic components, and a 5-year warranty on cables, guarantees that minimize maintenance and repair expectations. The equipment company uses recycled materials in its production, and manufacturing utilizes 100% wind and renewable energy sources.

Following the Community Health Needs Assessment, the Carrington Area Healthy Communities Coalition voted to undertake this project and approached the Carrington Park Board for initial approval to begin plans and establish a project partnership that will boost the outdoor recreation opportunities for children and families in our community. In February 2022, Coalition members presented the playground design and cost estimates to the Park Board and received anonymous approval to apply for grants and undertake the project. The park does not have a name, being generally referred to as the west or west end park. As a part of the promotion of this project, the Coalition will host a naming cost, which will encourage interest in the renovation and a sense of personal ownership in the park.

Operation and Maintenance

The renovation project will be “turn key” ready. Volunteers will assist in the removal of the current equipment and ensure the site is level. The playground equipment company will install the playground equipment, anticipating less than two weeks for completion. A contractor will be hired to complete the bathroom project and ensure all building codes are met. As an entity within the City of Carrington, building permits will be obtained but costs will be waived.

The Carrington Park Board has maintained the west end park and will continue to do so. The Park Board has sufficient funds in its operating budget to continue maintenance. Use of the park is free to all visitors.

The Carrington Community Connection grant program is supportive of the project and can provide the balance of funds if some grants are not received (up to \$40,000) to ensure the project can be completed. The project sponsors will obtain volunteer help to remove old park equipment and prepare the site; this includes members of the Carrington Garden Club, Carrington High School National Honor Society, and Carrington Lions organizations who have provided verbal support of our project. Assistance in the fall for grass seeding and flower planting will be provided from volunteers from the Carrington High School FFA and the Carrington Garden Club.

Plan:

Milnor is a progressive town bringing amenities to the residents of our community. Families need and want playground area, a safe place to have fun and enjoy the outdoors. Although there is a city park on the south side of town, children and families living on the north side of Milnor, living in the residential Northview area would not have ready access to this play area as it is almost 1 ½ miles from the subdivision. The City Park also does not have inclusive play. Inclusive play* is important element allowing children with disabilities the chance to enjoy a park setting with their friends.

The City has recently set aside a play area on a large corner lot (114' 124') in the Northview subdivision. Seventeen large trees were planted in the playground in 2021. Our next step is to put in activities that children and adults would enjoy. The playground would have amenities for children and adults, including inclusive play systems and a cemented basketball court. Wood fiber would be used within the play area for the safety of the children. A grassed area would surround the play area. We would use a border to keep the wood fiber and grassed areas separated.

The project is expected to proceed in August of 2022 or as funds become available through fundraising. No permits will be necessary as project has been approved by the city. The installation of equipment will be done by volunteers from the community.

Description of Project Features

The Hillsboro Park District is seeking additional funding to install energy-efficient Musco lights on the main field of Hillsboro's Olsen Softball Complex. The complex serves nearly 200 Hillsboro-area youths each spring and summer as home to the community's T-ball, Little League and summer softball teams, as well as the local school team, the Hillsboro-Central Valley Burros – about 14 teams total.

Due to Hillsboro's central location, the complex is becoming an increasingly desirable location to host tournaments, and also is an ideal neutral site for teams across eastern North Dakota and western Minnesota to meet to play. In 2021 Olsen Softball Complex hosted practices and games for a total of more than 700 area youths from both its home and visiting teams.

Hillsboro has seen a 30 percent increase in summer rec participation in recent years, and that number is expected to continue trending upward along with the rising enrollments at the local school district. The community of Hillsboro is expanding with a new housing development geared toward young families, for which the recreation facilities are a tremendous draw.

In order to meet the rising demand for youth participation and available field time, the Hillsboro Park District is looking to increase the number of playable field hours at the complex. Not only will this allow for more innings of various sports to be played at the complex, but the park district also will have more flexibility in scheduling games throughout the spring and summer. This can help with the popularity of the programs because fans will be able to attend more games outside of standard working hours. The flexibility also is ideal from a safety standpoint; it would help alleviate the need for some of the practices and games to be held during the hottest times of in periods of excessively hot and humid weather.

The Hillsboro Park District has been saving for this project and is contributing \$75,000 cash – about 60 percent of the total project cost for the lights and installation. The lighting system comes with a 25-year warranty, and maintenance will be overseen by the park district as part of its annual budget.

Several local businesses and individuals also have stepped up to pledge donations to the project, and the youth teams are continually working on fundraising. We are hoping the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District can help us fill the gap so we can get the project in place before summer.

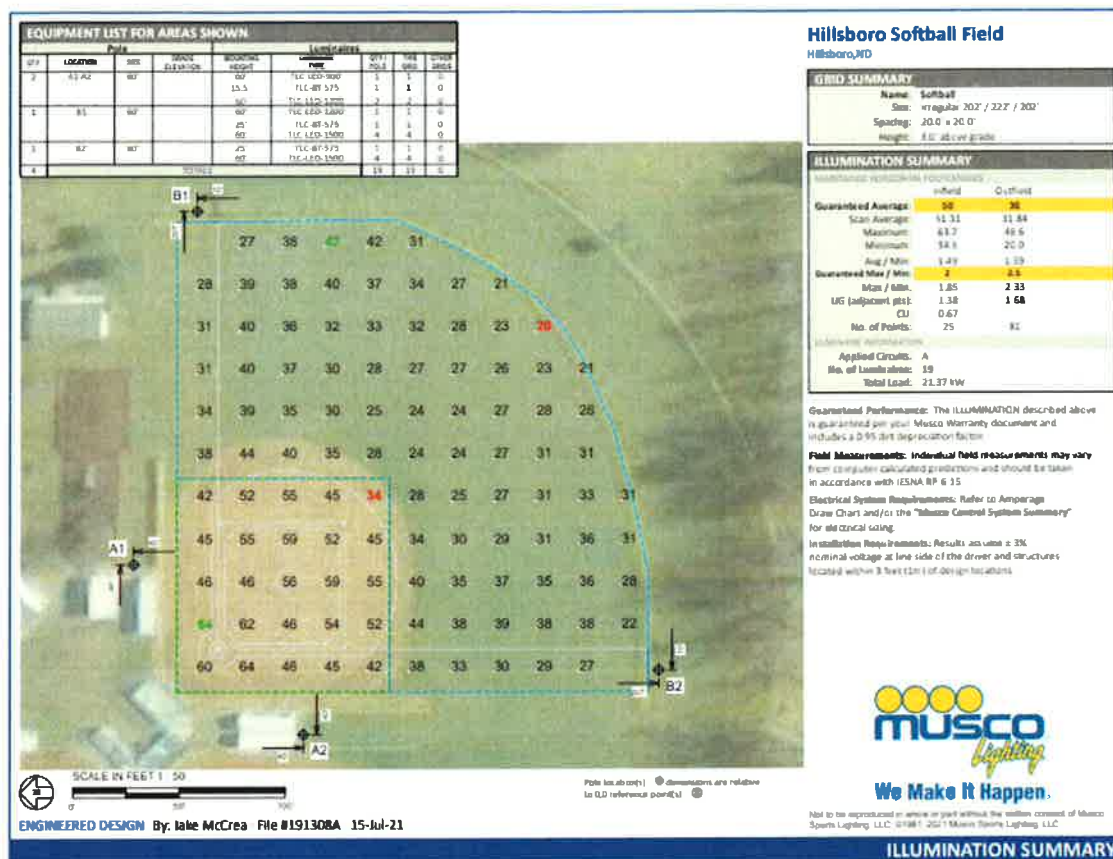

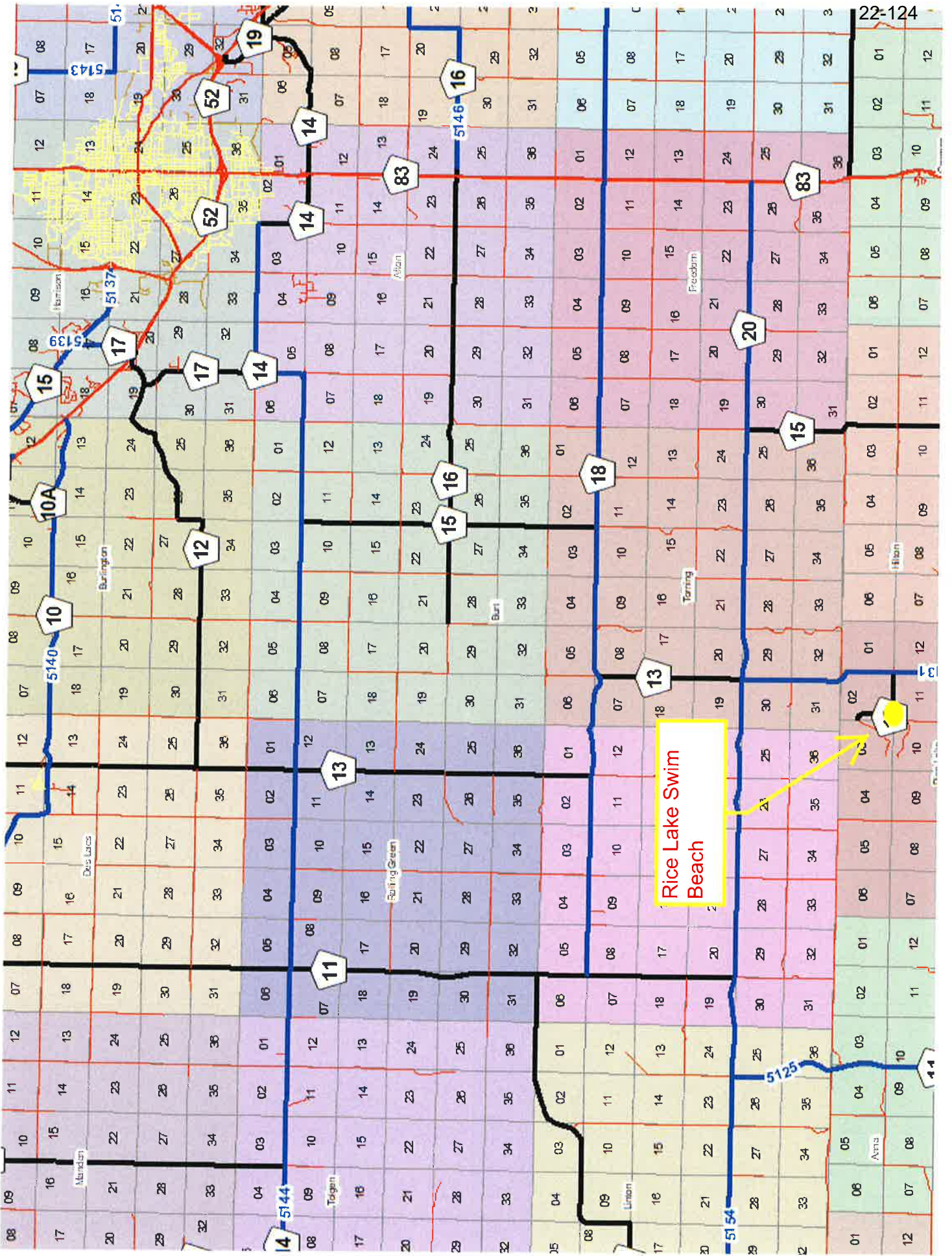

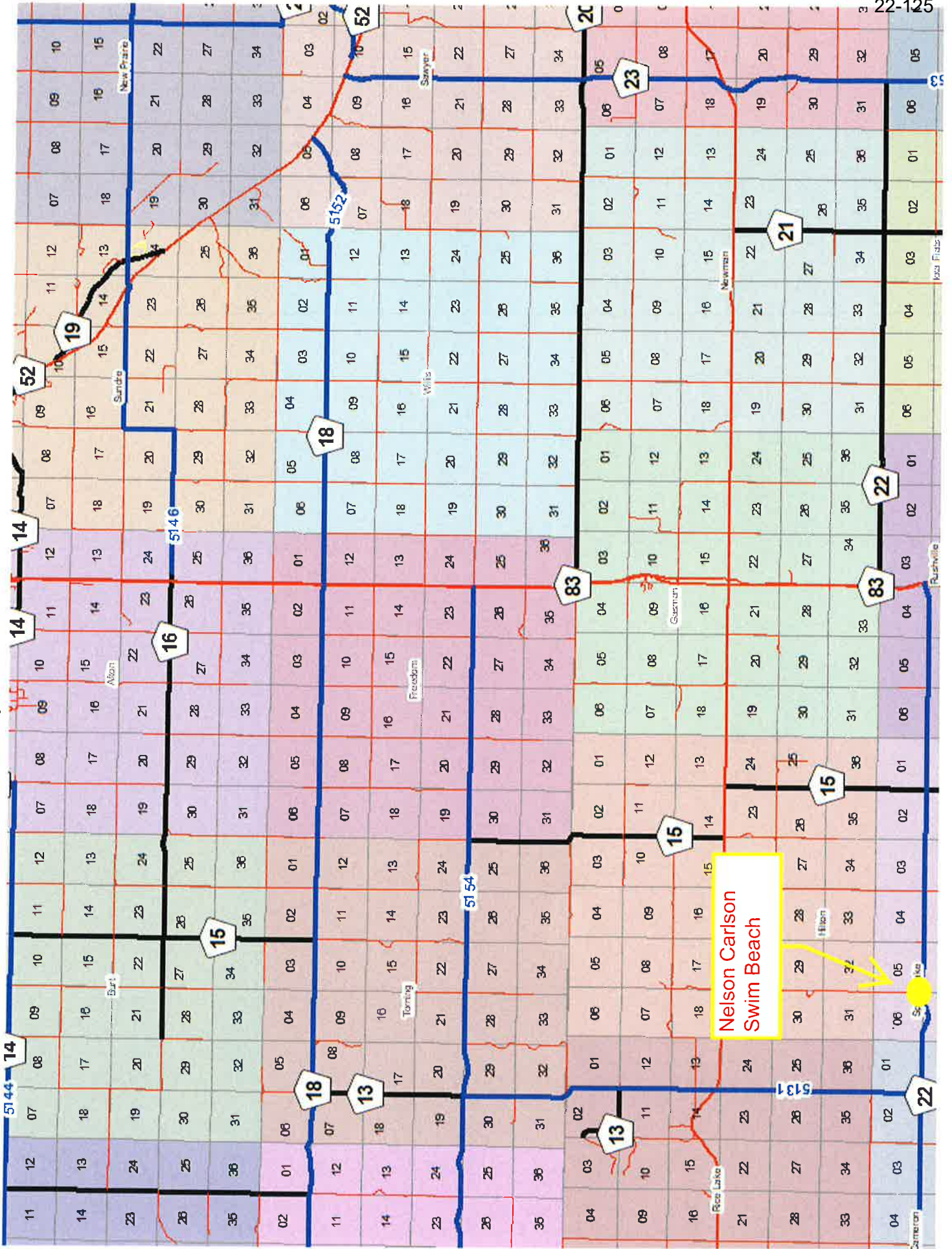

The City of Wildrose, in conjunction with a committee of patrons, is planning, designing, and implementing a public garden site on city owned property. The property is located on Main Street and is next to the local day care facility and photography studio. The public garden will provide young persons and adults an opportunity to establish and care for garden plots of various sizes and soil types at no cost. The city has a current water supply for the plots and will provide water for the gardens. The water usage will be monitored, and cross contamination will be properly addressed. All water cost will be paid by the city and/or local donations.

The purpose of the garden will be to teach young people the art of gardening and educate them about the connection between agriculture and food sources for the family table. Produce will be property of the gardener or donated to support local food pantries and patrons. Local area gardeners will plan "gardening day camps" for area children and the day care facility, located next door, will utilize the garden for recreation and education. A low wood fence will be constructed to separate the garden from Main Street; thereby, protecting young gardeners from accidental movement to the street. Adequate distance between beds and the entrance to the plots will be handicapped accessible.

Startup costs will include timbers and/or cinder blocks to divide plots and prevent run off water and soil, purchasing and hauling topsoil, mulch, and fertilizers as needed. The project will include building a wood barrier between the street and the garden. The city, patrons, and local organization will provide the labor and equipment. A projected budget for the project and a sketch of the location of the plots are attached.

One of the priorities I set forth as Mayor was to purchase and "clean up" blights in the city. The city has successfully moved forward, and therefore has these properties available for development. Many of the local people, myself included, believe this project will provide an avenue for all ages to come together to learn, have fun, and gain a sense of value to our community. A small town does not provide numerous activities for our youth. This project will provide on such opportunity.
